














President's Message

This past year has again reminded us that the resilience of our organization is directly linked to the passionate support of our team of volunteers, corporate sponsors, and individual donors. Heading into the COVID-19 pandemic, it was quickly clear that we had our work cut out for ourselves to maintain our pace. It is with great honor that I formally announce that with the 2021/22 academic year scholarships, Kids' Chance of California (KCOCA) has officially awarded \$1,000,000 in scholarships directly paid to students. It was the financial strength of our organization and the undying support of our volunteers and contributors that led KCOCA to not only stay on track to meet our goal of awarding \$1,000,000 by the end of 2022 but allowed us to meet and exceed that goal EARLY! Here are some of this year's highlights:

- We awarded scholarships to 51 students, our largest class yet and another record-breaking year for our state organization. This accounts for a 16% increase from 2020 and 34% increase since 2019.
- Awards issued to these 51 students totaled over \$244,000 which was a 10% decrease from 2020 however a 28% increase from awards in 2019.
- While in past years we have awarded 75% to 100% of the students' unmet financial needs, this year we were only able to cover 40%. Not only was the pool of eligible students the largest we have seen yet, but their financial needs were at an all-time high. To award all 51 students 100% of their need, we would have issued over \$800,000 in awards this year alone.
- We are proud to report that we have aggressively continued to manage our operational costs to 10%, with 90% of every dollar going directly into the scholarship program.



Looking ahead...

According to the latest Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries, workplace fatalities in California continue to rise to the highest we have seen in our state in over a decade. Workplace fatalities are up 20% just over the last two years. When I hear these alarming statistics and the stories of the families impacted by these tragedies, I know KCOCA has helped and will continue to support these children and their families.


